Perhaps the best indicator of God's movement has been baptism. Previously our high-water mark was 11 men baptized at a single service. However, 20 men took the plunge on May 19! Jasen was one of the baptized men who was very excited about the experience. In reply to why he wanted to be baptized, Jasen answered, "So that I can have a new beginning and a new walk with Jesus. Also because I trust in Jesus and want to be united with other believers." In addition, two service team members (Brian and Mike) made professions of faith. That evening a total of 22 men committed to follow the Lord Jesus Christ. # **Returning Hearts at Angola Prison**

Recently Pastor Rick and I visited the Angola Prison in Louisiana. We were part of the Returning Hearts Celebration, an event that unites children with their incarcerated fathers for an unforgettable day of games, food, and relationship building. Surrounded on three sides by the great Mississippi River, Angola Prison is set on 18,800 acres. It has six different camps, together housing 6,300 inmates. From 90 to 95 percent of these men are serving life sentences. At one time, Angola was known as the most violent prison in the USA. Warden

Burl Cain changed all that by helping to get a Baptist Seminary inside the walls of this prison. Cain believed that if he could rehabilitate the men's souls it would minimize the violence. Soon

prison violence decreased by 80 percent.

On May 13–14 we volunteered at Malachi Dads, an event organized by Awana Lifeline. Their theme verse is "He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers" (Mal. 4:6). We went to a graduation of 124 on Friday night. Before these men graduated, they dedicated almost a year of their life to studying what it meant to be a Christian dad and raising their children to fear God. What a night of praising and worshipping the Lord!

On May 14 there were 600 children

who reconnected with their fathers for the day (265 dads). As family assistants, Rick and I followed around a family for the day, serving them in whatever way we could. There were games to play where the kids could collect Awana Lifeline money that they could use later to purchase some gifts to take home with them, as well as many other activities that they could do together. There were 474 volunteers from 26 states that helped to make this happen.

The day was an emotional rollercoaster. At the beginning of the day we

witnessed fathers reuniting with their kids. At the end of the day we saw tears being shed when they separated for most likely another year. The most gutwrenching part was when 35 dads were

left sitting in the stands because their children didn't show up. We could only speculate why they weren't there. Nevertheless, we felt the pain cut deep into our own hearts. Pastor Rick and I witnessed the work God is doing inside prison walls. Some may say that this is a miracle, but I say it's part of God's great revival. Please pray for the work that is flourishing in Angola and that it will gain momentum in the lives of inmates, guards, and prison staff. Pray that God will move so that these concepts may be integrated into New Life's ministry at the Newton Correctional Facility.
