
Pedal for Prisoners VII

From April 23–29, the Stephen Ministry Leaders Training Course (LTC) was held in St. Louis. Gathered with over 300 Christians from across the country, Rick and Rose Admiraal and Marv and Myrna Goodyk learned how to lead, supervise, and train Stephen Ministers within our congregations. Stephen Ministers are members of the congregation who receive specialized training to provide one-to-one Christian care.

New Life began training Stephen Ministers last fall with Larry and Cindy Lubinus as our trainers. We'll finish the 50-hour training course in September. Then we as leaders will assess inmates trained as Stephen Ministers who will be paired up with another inmate in need of care at the Newton Correctional Facility. 
In the past two months, we were able to conduct two such weekends in the Newton Prison system. The first was held in the Newton Correctional Facility and the second at the Release Center. The first event was held March 30-April 2, with 30 volunteers who spent four days with 87 inmates studying the Word, listening to talks, and worshipping together. Our theme song was "Chain Breaker." During the weekend, many men found out what it was like to have those chains broken by a Prison-Saving Savior. Several men recommitted their lives to the Lord. As a result, Pastor Rick was able to baptize twelve men and have two profess their faith in Christ.

On May 18–21, we were able to bring BIB into the Release Center for the first time. Eighteen volunteers and twentyfour inmates spent four days in their gym. On Sunday afternoon, we held a baptism and reaffirmation service. Five men stepped forward to be baptized, and twelve more came forward to make profession of their faith. Watching the transformation that takes place in the men during those four days is breathtaking! Before BIB, there had been a small group of men meeting at 5:30 each day around a picnic table in the weight yard to study the Bible. During the weekend, that group more than doubled in size. Christians were able to find each other after the weekend of BIB.

We see a real hunger for God's Word and Bible study in the prison. It was once said that if there was to be a revival in America, it would start behind the prison walls. We are seeing tremendous spiritual growth in the prison. We give God the glory. Even though we are called to plant the seed, it is God who gives the increase. After this spring's event, first-time BIB volunteer Ken Stursma said, "It was a great time of fellowship and worship." Two other first-timers were Ed Meinders and Del Zuidema. Ed reflected, "I felt privileged and blessed to attend." Del added, "I saw what God can

Pastor Rick can fill you in on what it means to become a mentor, visit one-on-one with an inmate, and encourage him in his spiritual life. God is good, all the time.
